Environmental demands

to contribute however modestly to environmental causes and today's stakes in forest development

to direct all actions and interventions on the basis of national and international environmental legislations and jurisprudence

to limit the impact of human activities on the environment to promote fair trade of forest products, especially wood and wood-derived products

to stay informed of the latest scientific environmental discoveries to acquaint ourselves with and encourage natural and ecological functioning to ensure environmental consistency of actions and interventions to maintain and enhance forest resources and their contribution to the world's carbon cycles

to maintain the health and vitality of forest ecosystems
to maintain and encourage forest production functions
to maintain, sustain and enhance biological diversity in forest ecosystems
to maintain and enhance the protection of forest management functions
(including ground and water)
